MUSIC NOTES

Anthem: O Mysterium Ineffable – Jean-François Lalouette (1651-1728)

Jean-François Lalouette was a French composer who studied with the renowned Lully. He was also Lully's musical assistant until he falsely claimed some of Lully's music as his own. Lalouette was also sometime Choirmaster at Rouen Cathedral.

Motet: Blessed Jesu, Mary's Son – Lutheran hymn 'Liebster Jesu,

wir sind hier' (Blessed Jesu, we are here) BWV 731 -

J.S. Bach (1685-1750)

'Liebster Jesu', or 'Blessed Jesu', is a Lutheran hymn by J R Ahle upon which J.S. Bach wrote numerous chorale preludes. Today we will hear the choir sing the hymn with Bach's harmonisation, followed by a particularly florid organ version of the same hymn.

Postlude: 'Toccata' from <u>Suite Gothique</u> – Léon Boëllmann (1862-1897) Boëllmann composed around a hundred and sixty pieces throughout his short life, but his <u>Suite Gothique</u>, written in 1895, is by far his most famous.

The Ministry of the Word

<u>Reading</u>

A reading from the first book of Samuel.

[The author of the books of Samuel and Kings tells the story of Israel's monarchy from the time it was set up about 1020 BC by Samuel, the last of the Judges.]

Then all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah, and said to him, 'You are old and your sons do not follow in your ways; appoint for us, then, a king to govern us, like other nations.' But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, 'Give us a king to govern us.' Samuel prayed to the Lord, and the Lord said to Samuel, 'Listen to the voice of the people in all that they say to you; for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. Just as they have done to me, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so also they are doing to you.

Now then, listen to their voice; only you shall solemnly warn them, and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them.'

So Samuel reported all the words of the Lord to the people who were asking him for a king. He said, 'These will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen, and to run before his chariots... He will take your male and female slaves, and the best of your cattle and donkeys, and put them to his work. He will take one-tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves; but the Lord will not answer you in that day.'

But the people refused to listen to the voice of Samuel; they said, 'No! but we are determined to have a king over us, so that we also may be like other nations, and that our king may govern us and go out before us and fight our battles.'

The Epistle

A reading from the Epistles ('the letters') of New Testament Read firstly in **English**, then in **Chinese**.

[Paul had a lot of difficulties with the church in Corinth. After writing 1 Corinthians, things got worse. Titus brought Paul news of an improvement, and Paul writes to explain his actions.]

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians.

But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture – 'I believed, and so I spoke' – we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

The crowd came together again, so that they could not even eat. When Jesus family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, 'He has gone out of his mind.' The Nicene Creed

Let us stand and confirm the faith of the church

This is my blood of the new covenant shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded: proclaiming his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again, we celebrate with this bread and this cup, his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice
